NOTICE FOR INTERNSHIP

The Delhi Judicial Academy is engaged in judicial education for judges of Delhi and other States. The Academy is also engaged in research into issues relating to adjudication, including certain specific projects assigned to it.

The Academy invites applications from interested law students from recognized universities for internships at the Academy. Interns will work with the faculty, and the research team to assist in organizing judicial education programmes of the Academy, as also other research activities of the Academy. The candidate(s) should be citizen(s) of India. As per the existing policy of Delhi Judicial Academy:-

1. The applicant should be in the second or third year of the three year LL.B programme or in the third, fourth or fifth year of the 5 year law programme.

2. The Academy shall engage two interns at a time for a period of 1-2 months.

3. Stipend of Rs. 5000/- (Rupees Five Thousand Only) shall be paid by the Academy to the selected candidate on the completion of the internship.

It may be noted that the internship is a full time assignment. It would however not confer any right of permanent employment at Delhi Judicial Academy. The intern will not be entitled to practice or take up any other assignment during the period he/she interns at the Academy. Ethical breaches by interns will be viewed seriously and will disqualify him/her from receiving an experience certificate and the stipend.

Interested law students may send their applications through email i.e. dja@nic.in, speed post or submit their applications by hand at the reception of the Academy. Applications should be submitted at least 60 days prior to the desired date of commencement of the internship. Internships shall be offered on a rolling basis, if vacancies exist, and if the Academy requires interns for the period applied for.

Interested students should submit the following documents along with their application:

1. A bona-fide certificate from the University/college indicating the current class that the student is in, and that he/she is a student of the university/college.

2. A transcript of marks from admission till date.

3. A writing sample, either published or unpublished. The sample should not be a co-

4. Name of two referees with contact details, who may be contacted if required.

Suitably qualified candidates may be interviewed if needed on the sole discretion of the Competent Authority.
